South Australian of the Year Awards | Education

The Flinders University Education category aims to acknowledge the successes of exemplary South Australian teachers, schools, registered training organisations, and universities that provide excellence in teaching leading to improved learning, increased student wellbeing and expanded opportunities.

Judges are asked to score the nominee against each selection criteria.

Judging Structure

- Judges are asked to score the nominee against each selection criteria point
- Scores between 1 and 10 (1=lowest, 10=highest) will be given for each selection criteria point
- The maximum score able to be given by judges for the Education category is 180.

Education category selection criteria:

Personal Integrity / Influence / Leadership

1. Personal values
2. Personal, academic and professional achievements within the past 12 months
3. Demonstrated leadership, innovation and creativity
4. Experience as an inspirational role model, mentor and/or advisor for the South Australian Education community

Professional and Personal Contribution and Service

5. Demonstrated excellence within the Education system
6. Create stimulating and challenging learning opportunities through innovative curriculum
7. Create safe, inclusive and supportive learning environments
8. Build effective relationships and partnerships with parents, the community & industry within the educational institution
9. Contribute to planning, development and management
10. Demonstrated ability to adapt to change and embrace new opportunities
11. Nature and length of activity or service within the South Australian Education system
12. Future goals and likely impact on the education system in South Australia
13. Degree of difficulty of the achievement and sacrifices made

Community Contribution and Service

14. Proven contribution to the South Australian Education community
15. Contribute to the confidence, resilience and success of the South Australian Education community
16. Implemented policies and projects that positively impact on the South Australian Education system and generate outcomes that have a long term benefit
17. Voluntary work beyond paid employment
18. Community participation and leadership.
